Surely, you've heard it at least a million times from those who punched the parent time clock before you: "It goes by so fast!" And yet, here you are now, wishing you could turn back the hands of time and asking yourself, "Where did the time go?"

Once your son or daughter is immersed in Samford life, they will become accustomed to organizing their day by the clock tower and the carillon bells that chime every 15 minutes. Before you know it, they will be asking the same question: "Where did the time go?" We only have them here at Samford a short time, but even the layout of our campus reminds students of a greater plan that God has for them.

Samford's bell tower symbol has been used in the school's primary logo in several forms over the last three decades. It is a symbol of time-honored tradition and scholarly excellence. The symbol is a simplified representation of the bell tower atop the library. The hands on the clock inside the logo are set at 6:05 to reflect the verse engraved on the front gates of our beautiful campus taken from Deuteronomy 6:5 and Mark 12:30-31: "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy strength, and with all thy mind: and thy neighbor as thyself."

Time may be a thief, but it can never steal the love you have for your children. Now you are entrusting your sons and daughters to Samford University to teach and guide them over the next four years. Everyone in the Samford community commits to do all within our ability to help them reach their full potential and eternal calling. **THINGS TO DO**

- Make sure your student has added you as an authorized user in his or her financial portal.
- Student information is restricted by FERPA. Make a plan with your student about how and when they will share academic information with you.
- □ Help your student prepare, health wise:
  - Make a plan in case of a medical emergency.
  - Provide a first aid kit to keep in their car and/or dorm.
  - Send copies of health insurance cards.
  - Ensure your student has set up and completed their Med+Proctor account.
  - If your student requires medication, plan to send a month's supply and begin the transfer process to a local Birmingham pharmacy.
- Remind your student of sorority and fraternity recruitment deadlines. (samford.edu/greeklife)
- Watch for emails to register for Family Weekend, September 26-28, at samford.edu/parents/family-weekend. Make a note of upcoming deadlines for state t-shirt orders.

When you arrive on the day of your student's chosen move in, signage will direct you to know where you may offload your student's belongings and then park. As soon as your student's room is set up, you will want to say goodbye so your student can jump into an amazing college experience.
