FINDING ART // FOR SEEING

LIVING WORSHIP // FOR DOING

Challenge your worshippers to focus in on one part of their lives that they may turn over to God, trusting God to be faithful.

Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us. -Psalm 62:8

MAKING SPACE // FOR WORSHIPING

Similar to the morning prayer, hold your worship service in a space that allows for natural light of the sunset to be present. You may find a place outside at dusk or a room inside with windows that allow the haze from the end of the day to seep in.

WRITING POETRY// FOR PRAYING

In worship, give your worshippers resources needed so that they may write their own versions Psalm 62. How would they describe their faith in God? What elements of nature or daily observations would they compare it to?
