CREATING DRAMA // FOR HEARING

Gain a new perspective for Psalm 62:1-8 by using Eugene Peterson's translation from The Message. The more personal language might help worshippers connect to David's prayer in a different way, giving depth to the passage.

"My help and glory are in God—granite-strength and safe-harbor-God—So trust him absolutely, people; lay your lives on the line for him. God is a safe place to be."

-Psalm 62:7-8, The Message

FINDING ART // FOR SEEING

During the prayers of the people use visual aids, a further realization of the prayer. You might use a work of art, a photo, or an artistic impression of the situation prayed for.

"We prayer for the land, the sea, the sky - for your whole creation..."

LIVING WORSHIP // FOR DOING

Challenge your worshippers to find several opportunities daily to change the way they act as the body of Christ in the world. What areas of their life can they challenge themselves to give over to God that God might use them for his purpose?

MAKING SPACE // FOR WORSHIPING

As the service wraps up, the series and worshippers prepare to enter back into their daily lives. Have the worship service in an outdoor space.

WRITING POETRY// FOR PRAYING

Consider using the following benediction from the Iona Community:

One: The cross,
All: We shall take it.

One: The bread,

All: We shall break it.

One: The pain,
All: We shall bear it.

One: The joy,

All: We shall share it.

One: The Gospel,
All: We shall live it.

One: The love,

All: We shall give it.

One: The light,

All: We shall cherish it.

All: God shall guide it. Amen.

the sustaining goodness of your creation (10 second silence)
the new creation in Christ and all gifts of healing and forgiveness

(10 second silence)

— the gifts of relationships with

others (10 second silence)
— the communion of faith in your church (10 second silence)

All: Almighty and everlasting God,

you have brought us in safety to this new day. Preserve us with your mighty power, that we may not fall into sin nor be overcome in adversity. In all we do, direct us to the fulfilling of your purpose; through Jesus

Christ our Lord. Amen.

[I will offer prayers on our behalf. At the conclusion of each set of prayers, I will say, "Lord in your mercy." Please respond: "Hear our prayer."]

One: Gracious God, we pray for the

faithful all over the world, that all who love you may be united in your service. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: We pray for the peoples and

leaders of the nations, that they may be reconciled one to another in pursuit of your justice and peace. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: We pray for all who suffer from

prejudice, greed, or violence, that the heart of humanity may warm with your tenderness. We pray especially for all prisoners of politics or religion and for all refugees. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: We pray for all in need because of

famine, flood, or earthquake, that they may know the hope of your faithfulness through the help of others. Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: We pray for the land, the sea, the

sky— for your whole creation, which longs for its redemption. We pray that we may live with respect for your creation and use your gifts with reverence. Lord,

in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: We pray for all who suffer the

pain of sickness, loneliness, fear, or loss, that those whose names are in our hearts, in the hearts of others, or known to you alone, may receive strength and courage.

Lord, in your mercy,

All: hear our prayer.

One: God of compassion, into your

hands we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy now and forever. And now, we

pray as you taught, saying:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy name.

Thy kingdom come, thy will be

done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our

debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory,

forever. Amen.
