Candidates are required to take integrate technology into all of their classes as part of the Teacher Education program at Samford University. This provides the skills necessary to integrate current and emerging technologies effectively into curriculum and instruction. Professors both model the use of technology and require candidates to demonstrate proficiency at various levels. Throughout their teacher preparation program, candidates are required to integrate technology into various projects. Candidates must integrate technology into lesson plans and units. They are required to create projects such as a classroom website, webquest, multimedia essay, or an augmented reality project. When conducting an action research project with K-12 students, candidates use technology to collect and analyze data to identify an area of need in the classroom and determine what, if any, impact the candidates teaching had on student achievement. The data is also used to improve teaching and student learning based on the results. As a final assessment in the teacher preparation program, students are required to complete an electronic portfolio containing artifacts and rationale that demonstrate proficiency of both INTASC and ISTE standards. These artifacts include a technology-integrated lesson (both written and taught), edited video of technology use in the classroom, a digital citizenship. global classroom technology project, and an assessment of K-12 students' use of technology, and other technology-integrated artifacts.
