In Memory

ED LANDERS

This year, we honor the memory of Ed Landers. Ed Landers was a cherished member of our Samford family who touched the lives of many throughout his 31 years of service as the university's Media Center Manager. A proud Samford alumnus, Ed graduated in 1985, and his commitment to our institution continued throughout his professional life. Ed worked to create and continually innovate the livestream production of Step Sing, sharing the joy of Step Sing with audiences around the world. While we mourn his loss in September 2024, we celebrate the lasting impact he made on the tradition of Step Sing.

History of STEP SING

Step Sing began as a sing-along on the steps of Renfroe Hall at the Howard College East Lake Campus in **1951**, making 2025 a celebration of 75 years of Step Sing.

Sponsored by the Women's Service Organization, it was originally held once a semester and soon began to take the form of a competition. In the late 1950's, campus organizations decided to gather only once a year in December. They moved the competition to the steps of "Old Main," where each group sang two songs.

In **1957**, Howard College moved to its present location on Lakeshore Drive, bringing with it the tradition of Step Sing. Step Sing occurred in many different venues around campus including the cafeteria, Seibert gymnasium before moving its current location, The Wright Center, in **1976**.

Many changes, including the addition of costumes and props, took place during the **1960's**. In **1966**, emcees became a part of the action, and in **1967**, each group began choosing a theme around which to base its show. As the competitiveness of Step Sing increased, practice limits and caps on show length were added.

In **1971**, Step Sing celebrated its twentieth anniversary, and the Sweepstakes Trophy was added. A few years later, the first band accompanied the performances.

1988 was a significant year in Step Sing history. There was controversy regarding dancing on campus leading to the first non-competitive year of Step Sing. Step Sing returned to its competitive structure the following year.

In the **1990's**, groups began using recorded music instead of the Step Sing band. Step Sing Committee began awarding Committee Choice Awards.

Beginning in **2000** groups performed on a raked stage in the Wright Center. The stage was built at an incline of $\frac{1}{4}$ " per foot to provide a better view of formations to the audience. In **2012**, the Saturday evening performance was live streamed for the first time. In **2014**, the stage returned to a traditional flat stage due to improved camera angles and to allow more creativity with props and background images/videos.

Due to popular demand, a matinee show was added beginning in **2014**. Step Sing has continued to grow, increasing group size to 80 participants per group and inviting three new groups to the stage in **2025**- The Other Guys, Urban Essence, and Kappa Delta.

Under the direction of the Division of Student Affairs and the Office of Student Activities and Events, Step Sing is organized by students, including music arrangement, choreography, and costume design. Step Sing has become an educational activity in which the students participate through leadership development, organizational administration and time management, and continues to be one of the most popular traditions at Samford.

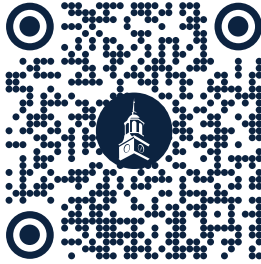

Banner Drop

Step Sing has developed many traditions over the years. Before Spring classes begin, students gather on campus for the event that officially kicks off the Step Sing season, Banner Drop. Held in the Wright Center, each group lets their banner drop from above to reveal their show's title. It is a tradition that each show's theme be kept secret until as close to the show opening as possible. Because of this, at Banner Drop, the title and banner are creatively used to throw off those that are not in the show! The banners are judged at this event, and the first-place group participants have the first choice for participant tickets. Following Banner Drop, the banners are displayed in the cafeteria and then moved for the show weekend to the Wright Center Lobby for our in-house audience to enjoy!

Judging

Shows are judged during both Friday and Saturday evening performances by a different panel of judges. For this year's 75th anniversary, our Judges Panel honors Samford Alumni who have been notable in Step Sing or have experience in music, theatre, and dance.

Although each judge is selected for his or her experience in a specific area, each judge gives a score in every category. The combination of these opinions rewards the most well-rounded group that is both technically proficient and entertaining.

Judges do not see the shows before scoring to prevent bias. Score sheets are collected during intermission and at the end of the show to allow judges to score each half, account for the fact that they have not seen the show before and account for any potential bias caused by the order of the show.

Each show's highest and lowest scores are dropped, and the middle scores are averaged to provide the final score.

Scoring

Each show will receive a score of up to 100 points from each judge with a maximum of the following point values:

ENTERTAINMENT VALUE: 30 POINTS

MUSICAL QUALITY: 20 POINTS

(10 points for Song Selection & Arrangement and 10 points for Execution)

CHOREOGRAPHY: 20 POINTS

(10 points for Difficulty & Design and 10 points for Execution)

THEME DEVELOPMENT: 15 POINTS

CREATIVITY: 15 POINTS

Judged Awards

The primary awards decided by the score of our judges are:

SWEEPSTAKES AWARD: Awarded to the group with the highest score overall.

FIRST RUNNER UP: Awarded to the group with the second highest score.

SECOND RUNNER UP: Awarded to the group with the third highest score.

The Excellence awards are awarded to the groups with the highest score in a certain category given by the judges. The Excellence awards are:

EXCELLENCE IN MUSIC: Awarded to the group with the most points in the Music category.

EXCELLENCE IN CHOREOGRAPHY: Awarded to the group with the most points in the Choreography category.

EXCELLENCE IN CREATIVITY: Awarded to the group with the most points in the Creativity category.

Additional Awards

COMMITTEE CHOICE AWARDS: After spending extensive time working with the show directors and watching the shows develop from ideas to performance, the Step Sing Committee votes on which shows to recognize for having the Favorite Moment, Favorite Song, and Directors of the Year.

PARTICIPANT CHOICE AWARDS: Participants can vote for their favorite Step Sing show in the following categories: Music, Choreography, Costumes, and Emcee.

SPIRIT OF STEP SING AWARD: The Spirit of Step Sing Award is given to one member of each group chosen by the show directors as someone who embodies the energy and attitude of Step Sing.

STEP SING CHARACTER AWARD: Established in 2016, this is awarded to the group who demonstrates a spirit of congeniality and character in their actions on the stage and behind the scenes. This award is voted on by the Overall Step Sing Committee, the Office of Student Activities and Events, and the Wright Center Staff.

STEP SING PHILANTHROPY AWARD: The Philanthropy Award is presented to the Step Sing group who has raised the most money in donations to our philanthropy. The QR code that is included previously in this program keeps track of how much each group has donated and at the end of the four shows, the group that has the most donations receives the Philanthropy Award.

JUDGES

JAMES BRISCIONE || James Briscione is Samford Alum and two-time Step Sing participant. After graduating with a B.S. in Nutrition/Dietetics, James went on to work in some of the nation's top restaurants and later the Food Network. He is the first two-time Champion of Chopped, he Beat Bobby Flay, and is a regular host and judge across the network. With his wife Brooke, he has penned cookbooks, including the best-selling *The Flavor Matrix*.

MARION EUBANK || Marion Eubank is a Samford University alum and former Step Sing Director. He received a Music Education degree at Samford and a Master of Church Music from Southwestern Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas. Marion served over 30 years as Minister of Music and Worship Pastor at Green Valley Church in Hoover, AL. He and his wife Karen still reside in the Birmingham area.

DENISE GREGORY || Dr. Denise Jones Gregory holds a BS in Chemistry from Jackson State University and a doctorate from the Georgia Institute of Technology. She is currently the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs at Jackson State University. Previously, she served as Associate Provost of Student Success and Diversity at Samford University, a member of the Executive Leadership Team, and President's Council.

JOHN MCCULLOUGH || John grew up attending Step Sing as a guest of his mother who worked at Samford. John later attended Samford, where he met his wife, Amy. They have been married for 16 years, have two daughters, Emerson (10) and Amelia (7). The McCullough family has watched Step Sing almost every year since they graduated. John served as a worship pastor for 20 years and most recently doing leadership development for C-Suite executives around the nation.

TAI RICHARDSON, MS.ED. || Tai Richardson is a 2010 graduate of Samford University. She currently works as a Facilitator on the GEAR UP Jefferson County grant at University of Montevallo where she helps prepare high school students for post-secondary options. Previously, Tai worked in Residential Living at Samford University and Western Carolina University. Tai served as a Step Sing Judge in 2022 and as a makeup artist for a Step Sing show during undergrad.

DR. CJ UNDERWOOD || Dr. CJ Underwood is a 2013 graduate of Samford University. During his time at Samford, CJ competed in Step Sing all four years, and won the coveted Sweepstakes three years in a row! After graduation, CJ received his Doctorate in Physical Therapy and now oversees clinics for ATI Physical Therapy in the Birmingham area. He is married to his college sweetheart and they live in Homewood, AL with their daughter!

JUDGES

MACKENZIE EPPS || Mackenzie is a Samford alumna. During her time at Samford, she directed two sweepstakes-winning Step Sing shows and was a member of the Samford Dance Team. She is currently in her sixth year of teaching at Homewood Middle School where she has served as a show choir assistant director and coaches the middle school dance team.

JODY HUNT || Jody is General Counsel at Samford University. Prior to coming to Samford, he had a distinguished career at the U.S. Department of Justice, serving as Chief of Staff to the Attorney General and as Senate-confirmed Assistant Attorney General for the Civil Division. Jody was co-valedictorian of his graduating class at Samford and President of the Student Government Association. He earned his master's degree from Florida State University and his law degree from Columbia Law School. Jody performed in Step Sing in 1980 and later organized the first-ever staff Step Sing performance in 1985.

MEREDITH JONES || Meredith Jones is a 2006 graduate of Samford University. Meredith served as captain of the Samford Dance Team and as the choreographer of her sorority's Step Sing show, winning honors in Choreography. Meredith has trained dancers across the Southeast before returning to Birmingham in 2020. Meredith's students have danced with the New Orleans Saintsations, Knicks City Dancers, So You Think You Can Dance and the Eras Tour. She currently teaches at That's the Pointe in Chelsea, Alabama.

JOCELYN LONQUIST KLEIN || Since graduating from Samford with a BFA in Musical Theatre (2014), Jocelyn has performed professionally across North America and the Caribbean. She recently led the North American tour of *Cirque Musica Holiday Wonderland* alongside her husband, Casey. Last year, Jocelyn originated the role of "Courtney" in the North American tour of *American Girl Live!* with Mattel. Jocelyn has held many other notable roles in productions with Royal Caribbean, Argyle Theatre, National Tour productions, and off-Broadway premieres.
